Dear Friends

Jesus gives us a new commandment:

'A new commandment I give you: Love one another, as I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." John 13: 34



Jesus leaves the disciples with his last instruction, his last will and testament, 'Love one another as I have loved you'. This is the heart and soul of his message. In the law of Moses, the Hebrews were called to love God with all their soul, heart, mind and strength, and to love their neighbours as themselves. Here Jesus is calling his disciples not only to love others as they love themselves, but to love others as Jesus himself loves them. This is what's new about this commandment. He is creating a holy, sacred agreement or contract between them.

They are being called to live in communion with each other, to share with one another, to serve one another in simple acts of love and caring, not judging, or condemning, but forgiving. They are being called to love as Jesus loves.

So here is a question to reflect on:

Why do you go to church?

We would all express the answer in different ways, but I think most of us would answer by saying that we go to worship God, to be part of his community, the Church, and to be put in touch with some big realities about ourselves and the world.

But what if we also thought that coming to church meant learning to be a follower of Jesus, learning how to be his representatives in the world, what greater focus would that give us?

How might it change us and how might it change the world around us?

I wish you all a very happy and peaceful Easter season.

In February 2019 I attending a workshop on reducing food waste, run by eco congregation Scotland. Here are some of the points from the workshops.


Food facts

Did you know?

Almost 50% of all food waste in Scotland comes from households. We throw away **600,000 tonnes** of food and drink from our homes every year in Scotland, and **more than half** of this is food and drink we could have eaten.

Wasting this food costs the average household £460 a year, the equivalent of around £38 a month.

The food waste hierarchy: Ideally don't have any food waste in the first place (source reduction)





Did you know?

The waste of good food and drink is associated with **4%** of Scotland's total water footprint.

Food waste: The big picture

- 1/3 of the world's food is wasted
- Producing, distributing, storing and cooking food uses energy, fuel and water
- Each of these emits greenhouse gases contributing to climate change
- Food waste sent to landfill gives off methane gas – 25x more damaging than carbon dioxide

If we all stop wasting food that could have been eaten, the benefit to the planet would be the equivalent of taking 1 in 4 cars off the road.

Why is food wasted?

There are two main reasons why we throw away good food: we cook or prepare too much or we don't use it in time.

The foods we waste the most are fresh vegetables and salad, drink, fresh fruit, and bakery items such as bread and cakes.



Did you know?

We throw away more food from our homes than packaging in Scotland
